Communicators	Cedar students will be able to think and communicate in more than one language. They will also communicate using mathematical language and symbols.
Risk-Takers	Cedar students will have the daring to try new things, while sensibly managing risk. They will try to solve problems in a lot of ways. They will be brave and tell people what they think is right in a respectful manner.
Knowledgeable	Cedar students will explore relevant and significant concepts at school and will remember what they have learned. They will draw on this knowledge and apply it to new situations.
Principled	Cedar students will have principles. They will have a sense of fairness and will be honest with themselves and with others. They will have an understanding of moral reasoning.
Caring	Cedar Students will be caring people. They will want people around them to be happy and will be sensitive to their needs.
Open-Minded	Cedar students will know that people are different and may do different things. They will listen to other points of view and consider many possibilities before making a decision. They will celebrate the differences in the world.
